

Progress, Power Restoration, and Debris Cleanup

Since the storms hit Rockwall on May 28th, our community has been working tirelessly to recover. Initially, over 24,000 power outages were reported. Thanks to the relentless efforts of Oncor and additional utility teams, this number was reduced to just over 1,000 within three days. Cooling shelters were made available to provide charging stations and air-conditioning for those affected.

In response to the extensive damage, the City approved funding for additional bulk trash and debris trucks to facilitate swift cleanup efforts. Republic Services has been working diligently for weeks, at a cost of \$12,000-\$15,000 per day, clearing debris from North to South and West to East to ensure all areas are addressed.

Residents are reminded to keep landscape waste separate from other solid waste to expedite the process. Commercial properties, including businesses and HOA common areas, are responsible for their own debris removal. We appreciate the patience and cooperation of our residents as we continue these efforts to restore our city to normal.
